## Message from Deaconess Debbie Byrd

conveyed in March 4 Service

I wanted to tell you my story because you have been on this path with me during the last four (4) years. You have loved and supported me during my journey.

The Holy Spirit is alive and moving in this church and Hickory Bend. About six months ago the Spirit of God began clarifying the path I was to take. I was to begin my ministry as a Deaconess more fully. I was to be in the world as an advocate for love, justice and change. If I could find a way financially then I could do the work God had called me to do.

There were many nights of tears, fear, prayer, and little sleep. But the voice of God continued to say GO down this path I've called you on. I will be with you. Do not be afraid.

A way became clear. I could begin to take my social security early and work part-time at the church. But I still struggled with how this could happen. I loved my church, my pastor and its people. How could I do this? Who would help me serve the church with love and care. I discussed all of this with Pastor Melisa and she encouraged me to follow God's call.

Then one day God provided the answer. He brought Deane Gardner who attends Hickory Bend into the office. Deane told Pastor Melisa, "that God had placed a call on her heart to be in a church setting doing administrative work. Did Melisa know of any job openings?" Melisa called me into her office and said, "I think you will want to hear Deane's story."

Deane had been having the same discernment experiences I had. We would even wake up at the same time filled with the thoughts we were to be traveling a different path. I began to cry because at that moment I realized God had answered both our prayers. He had been working in both our lives for the same purpose. If she became the other part-time person then I would know the church would be loved and cared for as I had wanted. I would be free to follow my call as a Deaconess unrestricted by office duties.

I told Deane my story of this loud unrelenting voice that NOW is the time to go and be the Deaconess God had called me to be.

Meetings were held and Staff Parish agreed to allow Deane and I to share the office coordinator position. Beginning March 19 I will work in the office on Monday and Tuesday with Deane working Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. She brings many talents to this job and frankly some of her gifts are better than mine.

I will use Andrew Price as my home base to be a Deaconess in the community. I will continue to be involved in outreach ministries at AP such as Rest in the Curve, Second Harvest Food Bank, teaching and being a part of our church.

God is going to be using many people in ways they can't even begin to imagine. I know this because I feel the Spirit whirling and moving here and in the lives of people. We are going to make a difference in these churches and this community. We are going to be the change in the world one step at a time.

I want you to remember your faith and to keep moving. The Spirit is moving and so should we.

Remember fear is a liar. It will rob you of joy and keep you from moving. When you are afraid ask yourself what am I really afraid of. Once you know the answer then you can move through your fear and be the person God calls you to be.
