Jun 07 Wesley **Baby Wesley is born!**



Welcome to the world, Wesley! It is celebration time in APOPO's rat kennels today for the birth of baby Wesley and its two siblings. Wesley belongs to the species *Cricetomys gambianus*, commonly known as the African giant pouched rat, which are often born in litters of 2 or 3. APOPO's breeding program ensures that prospective parents of our future heroes are carefully handpicked to deliver healthy, happy and high-quality rat babies. A successful breeding program increases the likelihood of delivering excellent HeroRATs to detect landmines and tuberculosis.

APOPO's early experiences demonstrated that rats that grow up in the organization's kennels are easier to train and are more effective scent detectors. Since many rats are needed for mine action and TB detection operations, APOPO's research and development department is constantly working on ways to optimize the breeding program.

Our church follows a safe sanctuary policy that protects children, youth, and leaders. A copy of our policies will be available at the registration table.

The nursery will be available each evening beginning at 6:00 p.m. for those children who have not turned 4 by June 26, 2016. We ask that if parents/guardians choose to stay in the nursery with their child, that they are responsible for the supervision of their child. VBS is set up as rotations for specific age groups. Children/youth must rotate in the groups of their age/grade. Visitors may rotate with their friends/family member as long as it is one age group below/above their current age/grade.

CD's will be available for you to purchase. We are requesting a donation of \$4.00 for the CD's. They include songs from VBS as well as computer games. Checks can be made payable to the church.

All children and youth must have a registration form filled out. Graduated 8<sup>th</sup> grade youth and up can be helpers at VBS or they can rotate with the youth group. Adults can join Rev. Woody Adams for adult bible study in the Builders room in the Education wing each evening beginning at 6:30 p.m.

# VBS Information Sheet

We will be collecting cans for Second harvest food bank that can be brought each evening and placed on the steps of the stage. Our goal is:

250 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mrs. Christy's face

400 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mrs. Jenn's face

550 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Ms. Hope's face

700 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mr. Daryl's face

850 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mr. Jarrad's face

1,000 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Pastor Melisa's face

We will also collect money for our FUEL program. This is a program that the church supports. Food is given to over seventy identified students in need at Hickman Elementary and placed in their back packs for the weekend. This is a mission outreach of our church. You can place your coins/bills in the designated area each night on the stage.

Anyone wanting to decorate a white t-shirt needs to bring one by Wednesday evening so that they can wear it Thursday evening. Make sure you get your picture taken by the stage by Wednesday evening.

We will end VBS on Thursday evening by sharing communion in the sanctuary. Children will be invited to come to the stage and sing songs from VBS during our closing session. Families are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Children that are in the nursery must have a parent/guardian stay in the building during VBS. VBS is an intergenerational event. There must be a contact person present at VBS each session for children/youth attending VBS. Children/ youth will be released only to adults listed on their registration form. VBS ends each evening between 8-8:15 p.m. Children/youth can be picked up in the Fellowship Hall. Please list any allergies or special information on your child's registration form that we need to know.
