Second Harvest Food Bank

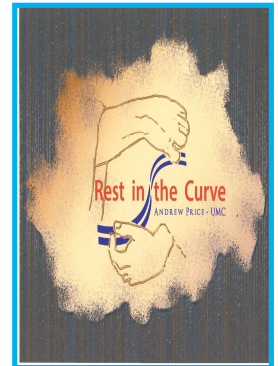

Dinner begins at 5:15 p.m. each evening (exception of Sunday evening which is potluck and will begin at 5:00 p.m.) Dinner serving line ends at 5:45 p.m. **It is very important that you sign up for meals each night you will be attending. There is a sign up sheet in the foyer.**

*A free will love offering will be collected each evening at dinner to help cover the costs of the meals. Please sign up for VBS meals (each night you are coming). There will be a sign up sheet during the month of May in the foyer to sign up for meals.

*VBS is for all ages

Our church follows a safe sanctuary policy that protects children, youth, and leaders. A copy of our policies will be available at the registration table.

The nursery will be available each evening beginning at 6:00 p.m. for those children who have not turned 4 by June 28, 2015. VBS is set up as rotations for specific age groups. Children/youth must rotate in the groups of their age/grade. Visitors may rotate with their friends/family member as long as it is one age group below/above their current age/grade.

CD's will be available for you to purchase. We are requesting a donation of \$3.50 for the CD's. They include songs from VBS as well as computer games. Checks can be made payable to the church.

All children and youth must have a registration form filled out. Graduated 8th grade youth and up can be helpers at VBS. Adults can join Sharon Rubey for adult bible study in the Topic room in the Education wing each evening beginning at 6:30 p.m.

The colors you can wear for VBS are:

Sunday – Blue

Monday – Red

Tuesday – Purple

Wednesday – Green

Thursday – Orange(or wear VBS shirt)

We will be collecting cans for Second Harvest Food Bank that can be brought each evening and placed on the steps of the stage. Our goal is:

250 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mrs. Christy's face

400 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mrs. Jenn's face

550 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Ms. Hope's face

700 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Mr. Daryl's face

850 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Alli's face

1,000 cans by Thursday evening to get a pie in Pastor Melisa's face

We will also collect money for our annual Back2School Bash. This is a mission outreach of our church. You can place your coins/bills in the designated area each night on the stage.

Coloring sheets/activity sheets will be available on Sunday-Wednesday evenings between 5:50 – 6:10 p.m. each evening. Anyone wanting to decorate a white t-shirt needs to bring one by Wednesday evening so that they can wear it Thursday evening. Make sure you get your picture taken by the stage by Wednesday evening.

We will end VBS on Thursday evening by sharing communion in the sanctuary. Children will be invited to come to the stage and sing songs from VBS during our closing session. Families are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Children that are in the nursery must have a parent/guardian stay in the building during VBS. VBS is an intergenerational event. There must be a contact person present at VBS each session for children/youth attending VBS. Children/ youth will be released only to adults listed on their registration form. Events end each evening between 8-8:15 p.m. Children/youth can be picked up in the Fellowship Hall. Please list any allergies or special information on your child's registration form that we need to know.
