Resurrection: The Miracle of New Possibilities
An Eastertide Reflection by Bill Mooney, April 6, 2015

Easter Sunday, Resurrection Day! Life after death! New possibilities!
Resurrection — miracles! The emergence of new possibilities!
We've seen it here at APMUMC where a death occurred, a vital ministry died.

Remember Friday nights, Room in the Inn?
Ten homeless women — our guests whom we transported,
and welcomed and fed, and for whom
we provided comfortable sleeping,
along with other amenities.
Jesus in our midst, "in as much ... "
For many years, November thru March —
During winter's cold — a life sustaining ministry!

Sadly, gradually it died; necessities, especially persons, dwindled, burned out.
Life support efforts failed, and death was announced.
Emotions were raw: sorrow, grief and guilt,
a feeling of failure, a sense of loss, a nagging emptiness.

We mirror life and death, crucifixion and resurrection in the church.
We celebrate new beginnings: births, graduations, marriages.
We acknowledge endings, remembering ministries faithfully offered and lives well-lived.
Room in The Inn at APMUMC died, its death a reflection of our world.
That death a mirror image of the reality with which we live and the faith by which we live.

Crucifixion and resurrection — key words in our faith vocabulary,
significant experiences in the journey we call life.
Crucifixion and resurrection, a cross at the heart of our faith.
For many, always with a Jesus figure; while others present it empty;
Each symbolic and metaphorical, giving us iconic paradigms of reality,
That reality in which we experience
crucifixion and death, resurrection and new possibilities.

The death of Room in The Inn was not the final word —
A resurrection occurred! The miracle of new possibilities happened!
Out of death, Rest in the Curve arose, out of death a new possibility!

Rest in the Curve, a new possibility — very new, still slowly emerging,
growing, developing, finding its way, its shape, its form.
Rest in the Curve, offering hospitality and warmth,
food and clothing and companionship and support,
and quiet, a refuge in the midst of struggle and hardship.
Rest in the Curve, a new way we respond to Jesus, to "the least of these"!
A new life sustaining ministry, out of death, the miracle of a new possibility.

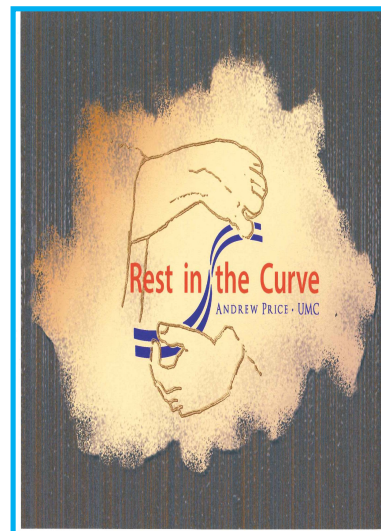
Rest in the Curve Ministry

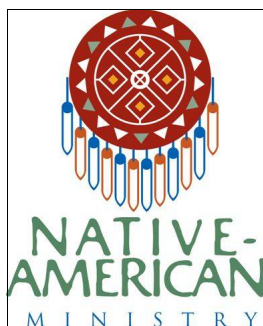
